
Guidelines

- If sharing the Social Script with a participant, help the participant comprehend key points, consistently monitoring for level of understanding.
- If sharing the Social Script with a participant, contextualised photographs can be used to summarise information and experiences.
- You may want to read the Social Script a number of times.
- Once the visit has taken place, revisit the social script to celebrate success.
- Download the social script in it's entirety to assist.

What is the Mayor's Party in the Park?

- The Mayor's Party in the Park is a free Costume Party themed children's event.
- I should bring money for activities or food if I want to buy something.
- I can experience;
 - Live music
 - Performers walking around who might be dressed in a costume
 - Activities
 - Rides
 - Market stalls
 - Much more can be found via the website or pamphlets.



When and where is the Mayor's Party in the Park

- The Mayor's Party in the Park is on Sunday 7th of April.
- The event begins at 10am and finishes at 2pm
- The location is **Cruden Farm** in Langwarrin.
- The address is 60 Cranbourne-Frankston Rd, Langwarrin VIC 3910.





What to bring to the Mayor's Party in the Park?


- I should bring some money if I want to buy food, drinks or buy something at a stall.
- I am welcome to bring a mobility aid; my service animal (if applicable), picnic blanket, headphones, sunglasses or anything to help me feel comfortable at the event.
- I can bring a water bottle to fill up for free at the water taps.





How can I get there?

- I can take **public transport** to the event and I can plan my journey via the Public Transport Victoria website https://www.ptv.vic.gov.au/journey
- I can drive and find parking nearby or ask someone to drive me.
- I can walk to the event if I live nearby
- I can find a map of the event on the next page.

Entering the Event

- I can enter the event from McClelland Drive or Cranhaven Road
- If I am catching the bus I should arrive at the Frankston Cranbourne Road bus stop
- If I need accessible parking I should let the entry staff know as I am driving in that I need this parking







Who can come to the Mayor's Party in the Park?

- Anyone is welcome to attend the Mayor's Party in the Park.
- It is a smoke, alcohol and drug free event
- I can't bring my pet, but a service animal is okay.





What if I need help?

If I need help I can ask one of the friendly staff onsite

Event staff wear a
Pink shirt with
'Event Staff' written
on the back



Security guards will be wearing a high visibility vest



First Aid will be walking around and where I can go to if I am hurt. They will wear a high visibility vest.





Accessibility Features

- Chill Out Zone where I can get away from noises and lights for a rest
- Accessible Toilets which I can find on the map
- Accessible carparks are located in each carpark, I can tell the traffic controllers and parking attendants I need these spaces and they will be able to tell me where to park
- **Signs** are posted around the site to help me find things
- I can use the **Map** to find my way around or ask the friendly staff onsite
- Information staff are located in the information marquee
- First Aid staff are located in the first aid marquee
- Service animals are welcome
- Seating options are available around the site
- Large signs and colourful teardrop banners show me that there is something there or staff nearby.



Attendees and Crowds

- I can expect many children and families
- I may need to wait in a queue at some food and market stalls
- If I don't like big crowds there are quieter areas on the event site such as the Chill Out Zone

- The Rides and Activities Area

I might find the activities or spaces in the yellow circles a little loud and busy.

- The Market Stalls
- The Rides and Activities Area
- The Entryway
- The Food Area





Sensory Guide – Low Sensory Areas

I might find the activities or spaces in the blue circles the quietest.

- The Chill Out Zone
- The Rose Garden (please note this section of the site requires a \$5 entry fee)





Amenities

Portable Toilets:

- These toilets are unisex.
- There is a separate accessible toilet at each toilet location.

Parent Facilities:

• There will be a Parent pod which is fitted with change table and chairs.









Activities

- The event has many friendly activities.
- Most stalls run themed activities. Some activities are calm such as colouring and other activities can be more active.
- Frankston City Libraries marquee will also have story times and books and a photo opportunity with props.









Entertainment Area

- The entertainment stage will run throughout the event from 10am – 2pm
- The stage may have talking or music.
- I can see people perform on the stage.
- The music might be loud, if it is a bit noisy I can go to a quieter area.
- I can sit down at the stage on hay bales, on the grass or my picnic blanket if I bring one.
- If I own noise cancelling ear muffs, I may wish to bring them and use them.





Event Dining

- There are snack and beverage stalls at the event. I will need to bring money to purchase any food or drink.
- The food stalls will be open for the whole event where I can purchase food or drinks
- There will be a variety of food available;
 - Hot and Cold food
 - Healthy food
 - Vegetarian options
 - Sweets
 - Beverages
- There are Hay Bales I can use to sit on. I may need to wait for one to become available.
- I can use the free water station. I can bring my drink bottle to fill with more water or drink from the tap.







Amusements and Rides

- I can go on the rides for free
- I can ride on the **Tea Cup Ride**
- I can ride on the Chair-o-Plane
- There may be flashing lights on the rides.
- Rides will not be very loud as they are small rides.








What's on at the event
